

The Family Reply Prompt

You offer to watch the kids Saturday night. The polished reply suddenly sounds like you offered the whole weekend. Use this prompt to keep the warmth without adding a promise you never made.

Keep the kindness. Keep the same promise.

The Prompt

Help me rewrite this family text. Keep it warm and direct, and keep my meaning. Do not add emotions, reasons, dates, promises or availability that I did not give you. If something is unclear, ask me instead of filling it in. Show my original and your suggested reply together, then list any changes in meaning for me to check. My draft: [paste your text].

Use it for: A family reply that needs a clearer or kinder tone without changing your boundaries.

How to use it

1. Paste only what is needed. Remove names or private details that are not needed to improve the wording.
2. Keep the promise specific. Say exactly what you are offering, including the day and time if they matter.
3. Compare the two versions. Look for extra availability, stronger feelings or commitments that were not in your draft.
4. Read it like yourself. Cut anything you would not normally say. Send it yourself after checking the meaning.

Saturday night is not the whole weekend

Your meaning: "I can watch them Saturday night for you." A rewrite offering "all weekend" changes the promise. Keep Saturday night in the final text. If the broader offer was already sent, a correction could be: "Sorry, I meant Saturday night. I'm not available for the whole weekend."

Catch an added promise

Compare these two texts. Point out every change to the promise, timing, availability or emotion. Do not rewrite either one yet. Original: [paste]. Suggested reply: [paste].
